Camp SMILE Parent Handbook





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Welcome to UCP's Camp SMILE!

We are excited to welcome you into our Camp SMILE family this summer! Your camper must arrive on the Tuesday of their session between 8:00 & 11:00 a.m. Please read below for the exact time. Check-out time will be on Saturday at 11:15 a.m. The campers will perform in a talent show from 9:30-11:00. Please plan to attend the show; the campers look forward to this all week.

Check-in:

Check-in times have been staggered to prevent long wait periods. Please try to adhere to them.

The Camp gates will not be open before 8:00 a.m. to ensure that we are ready for check-in.

Packing:

Camp is very hot and messy. You should send at least 7 outfits for the week. Remember to include swimsuits, tennis shoes, linens and toiletries. *Be sure that all clothing, pillows, linens, and luggage are marked with proper identification to ensure safe return.* Included in this handbook is an inventory sheet for you to inventory the clothing items sent with your child. Please make every attempt to fill this out; as it is very helpful to your child's counselor. We have also included a packing list for your convenience.

Medications:

ALL MEDICATIONS MUST BE PROPERLY IDENTIFIED WITH COMPLETE DIRECTIONS FOR USE. PRESCRIPTION MEDICATIONS MUST BE IN CURRENT CONTAINERS. Please send only enough medicine for the week with a few extra dosages- just in case. Place all medication bottles in a Ziploc bag and give to the nurse at registration. Do not pack medicines in suitcase. Upon arrival you will be required to fill out a medicine card with the nurse, indicating medicines, times & dosages.

Parent Guidelines

- 1. Our counselors are trained to treat their responsibilities at Camp SMILE as a job. The relationships they hold with your child and family will be professional. We ask that you please work with us to respect these boundaries. Camp SMILE is not responsible for any relationships formed between staff and families outside of camp, including babysitting and caregiving arrangements.
- 2. For the health and safety of our campers and staff, if you are not feeling well the day you are scheduled to be at camp, please call and cancel. We respect, appreciate, and need your cooperation in this matter.
- 3. Camp SMILE does not provide **pick-up/drop-off** services for our campers. If someone other than the parent or guardian on file will be picking up or dropping off your camper, please call the Director to make arrangements. In case of unusual circumstance, parents/guardians may arrange for an alternate person to pick up or drop off their child by submitting a request in writing to the Director no less than 24 hours before the camper's arrival/departure.
- 4. No **pets or non-service animals** are allowed on site without prior permission from the Director. The health and safety of our horses is monitored and maintained by the professional discretion of our Equine Director.
- 5. The camp **speed limit** is 9.5 mph.
- 6. No **weapons or firearms** will be allowed at Camp except those brought in and approved by the Director and/or Security Personnel for programming and/or security purposes.
- 7. Please **park** your car in the designated parking lot and walk to your destination unless you're given permission to drive. Fewer cars at camp and past the horses mean less chance of an accident.
- 8. No alcohol, drugs, or smoking is allowed on the premises.
- 9. Camp SMILE is not responsible for the **damage** of any items. Camp has no way of securing, locking or guaranteeing a special protection of any property. Please be aware that you are responsible for your own property.
- 10. Take care of our camp and the wonderful surroundings nature has provided us. Please stay on trails and abide by all rules at each area. **Please do not litter.**



Goals and Objectives

The mission of Camp SMILE is to *empower children* and adults with disabilities to live their lives without limits by providing an inclusive summer camp experience where there is no limit to the adventure. We offer a typical camp program with the medical support and trained staff needed to enable these children to participate as fully as possible.

- 1. To develop in each camper an enjoyment and appreciation of the natural surroundings they experience at camp.
 - Staff will foster discussion that will result in a heightened awareness of our setting and the impact
 of our environment. This is accomplished in a variety of activities including horseback riding, arts
 and crafts, and swimming. The outcome is increased appreciation for the outdoors and value of
 spending time in nature.
- 2. To give campers an opportunity for growth and development of self-confidence.
 - Campers will gain self-confidence as they participate in all activities to the extent of their physical capacity and listen to the encouragement offered by counselors and staff. Camp SMILE operates on a "Challenge by Choice" principle and counselors are trained to foster independence by focusing on campers' abilities and by encouraging campers to make their own choices.
 - NOTE: For some campers, just being away from home and family is an opportunity for growth and development of self-esteem, especially considering that these children live with disabilities.
- 3. To give campers opportunities to have new experiences and acquire new skills.
 - Participation in the variety of activities provided by Camp SMILE will allow campers to achieve a basic familiarity with new sports, art, and various activities that enhance some elementary skills.
- 4. To allow campers to improve their social skills by forming new friendships with campers and counselors.
 - Camp will provide a supportive, inclusive environment where campers will feel free to reach out to others and form new, long-lasting friendships by sharing in camp experiences together. Holiday parties, fundraisers, and weekend respite camps help to maintain these friendships throughout the year, which leads to the outcome of an increased support system for campers and their families.
- 5. To respect the rights and dignity of each camper.
 - Camp provides a place of inclusion, respect, and dignity for everyone who is on campus, in any
 capacity. Campers are free to be themselves, and counselors are trained to be respectful and to
 preserve dignity in every situation. In turn, everyone at Camp SMILE feels safe, supported, and
 encouraged to be their best selves.



Camp Activities

Camp SMILE boasts a variety of fun camp activities. We are committed to encouraging campers to participate in new activities and gain new skills and life experiences while at camp. Below are detailed descriptions of some of our most popular camp activities:

High Ropes Course

Camp Grace boasts a state-of-the-art high ropes course complete with a zip line and adaptive equipment so that we can maximize participation. The High Ropes course is chiefly operated by experienced, high ropescertified Camp Grace staff, with support from high ropes-certified Camp SMILE staff, to ensure the safety of our campers.

Horseback Riding

Three times a week, campers are given the opportunity to participate in horseback riding activities with Camp SMILE's horseback riding team. These activities may include trail rides around the lake, painting the horse to build comfort and trust between campers and their horses, and various games and exercises. The Horseback Riding Program is operated by Celisse's School of the Equestrian Arts. Owners Krystin Barrett, Certified Therapeutic Riding Instructor, and Jason Barrett, oversee a team of trained volunteers to ensure the safety of our campers.

Talent Show

Each week, campers prepare for the Camp SMILE Talent Show, a years-long tradition. Parents, guardians, and friends are welcome to this event, which shows off musical, dance, and other talents of our many campers. Please plan to attend this awesome event!

In addition to the above activities, campers have the opportunity to enjoy arts and crafts, archery, swimming, boating, fishing, science projects, and a wide variety of other activities.

Please review the Camp Grace Release and Disclosure Form for details on the risks involved with camp activities. Campers with severe, recent medical complications may require a doctor's note in order to participate in certain activities.

It is necessary to bring enough clothing for a change each day. We recommend seven (7) outfits for the weeklong sessions or four (4) outfits for a weekend session. We only wash "soiled" linens and clothes. You must also bring your own supply of wipes, diapers, swim diapers and pediasure/ensure, if used by your camper.

What Not to Bring:

Please do not bring anything with peanut butter (this includes items that may contain peanuts). Electronic devices are highly discouraged unless used for daily communication, rewards or successful night time routines. Please do not bring personal sports equipment or other valuables, as camp cannot be held responsible for their upkeep. Please label everything well! No money is necessary for food; three meals and two snacks per day are provided. However, there will be camp items available for purchase at check in.

Please Note:

Campers are expected to bring sufficient supplies of their medication(s), properly identified, with complete directions for usage. Send enough for the camper's entire stay, plus several extras. Remaining medication will be returned. Please do not send the ENTIRE prescription. <u>ALL medications must be sent in current prescription bottles</u>. <u>Over-the-counter medications must be in original containers and we can longer give campers over-the-counter medications without a prescription</u>. <u>This includes Motrin</u>, <u>Tylenol</u>, <u>Benadryl</u>, <u>Sudafed</u>, <u>Pepto-Bismol</u>, <u>Maalox</u>, <u>Tums</u>, <u>vitamins</u>, <u>nutritional supplements and natural sleep aides</u>, <u>such as melatonin</u>.

Notification of Illness/Injury

In all cases, the onsite nurse will decide when more than routine first aid is needed. All parents and/or emergency contacts will be contacted when more than routine first aid is needed as determined by the onsite nurse. The nurse on duty, the Camp Director and the camper's parent(s)/emergency contact will decide on the appropriate course of treatment.

Refund Policy

All fees will be refunded when notification of cancellation is received in writing **thirty (30) days** prior to the beginning of the camp session that camper has applied for. Closures due to weather and/or mass sickness will be dealt with on an individual basis for those paying in full.

The \$70 registration fee that holds a camper's spot is <u>non-refundable</u>.
